NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

During the period of 5 years from the date hereof the City Council has liberty to carry out the following works:

1. Pruning of trees and removal and replacement of dead, dying or dangerous trees;
2. Resurfacing or excavation and relaying of paths;
3. Pointing, repair and rebuilding of walls and repair and replacement of fences or gates;
4. Straightening and making safe of headstones which have become unstable and repair as far as practicable of any vandalised monuments – headstones may be laid down but not otherwise moved.

The City Council is to give 28 days notice of intention to carry out all works to the Archdeacon, provided that the Archdeacon may waive the period of notice in cases of work urgently required for reasons of safety. The City Council is to lodge at the Registry a report of the works carried out in the previous year, within three months of the end of the year.

The City Council has liberty to apply to the Court for directions or modification of the Schedule and the Archdeacon has liberty to apply to the Court for directions or to set aside the Faculty on the grounds that the works is unsatisfactory or the terms of the faculty have not been complied with.

A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.
