Four Psalms to Pray for God's Help

When you don't know what to pray, Scripture provides the words for you. You can use these prayers from Psalms to guide your request for help from God

H - "Hear me Lord and answer me for I am poor and needy."

Psalm 86:1

The first step is to let God know you need him and want His help.

E - "Establish my steps in your word." <u>Psalm 119:133</u>
Second, ask God for His direction and for strength to stand firm **in His promises.**

L - "Let your compassion quickly meet our needs because we are on the brink of despair." <u>Psalm 79:8</u>

P - "Protect me God because I take refuge in You. I say to the Lord, You are my Lord, apart from You I have nothing good." Psalm 16:1
